1) Role of the Park The Skagit Valley offers a very different conservation and recreation role than the adjacent EC Manning Provincial Park and Chilliwack Lake Provincial Park as well as North Cascades National Park and Ross Lake National Recreation Area This variety is important to the existing users and the provincial park system as a whole

Arrive at Manning Park Lodge in about 35 minutes from Hope EC Manning Park to Keremeos (about 15 hours) From Manning Park, follow Hwy 3 east to Princeton and continue 62 km to Keremeos Allow 15 hours To get to race start location if coming from Princeton, just before Keremeos watch for turnoff on right for Cathedral

Rising high in the mountains of Manning Provincial Park, the Skagit River flows south across the Inter-national Boundary into Washington State, reaching the sea some eighty miles north of Seattle In Canada, the river is wild, but south of the border, the Skagit is impounded by a series of three hydroelectric dams
